

Call for Participation

The eGov-Bus project provides citizens and businesses with improved access to virtual public services, which are based on existing national eGovernment Web services and which support cross-border life events. In an open workshop that is co-located with the 6th East European eGovernment days (EEGOV days) in Prague we will present project findings.

Seamless Integration of Complex Life Events

eGov-Bus facilitates cross-border life-events by orchestrating existing eGovernment services. This first workshop will focus on the eGov-Bus technology and methodology presenting an advanced platform for development and publishing of complex eGovernment services.

The workshop will demonstrate the capabilities of eGov-Bus and will demonstrate selected modules that are used to support complex life events. We will inter alia discuss and demonstrate advanced technologies for adaptive process generation, virtual repositories, enhanced webservice, or security and data protection.
